Newfoundland and Labrador's Iceberg Alley

When it comes to viewing icebergs, Newfoundland & Labrador is one of the best places in the world.

On a sunny day, these 10,000-year-old glacial giants are visible from many points along the northern and eastern coasts. They come in every shape and size, with colours from snow-white to deepest aquamarine. Despite their arrival from the Arctic every spring, our awe of them remains new, year after year. Icebergs are not to be underestimated. In 1912, only 400 miles from our coast, an iceberg like these sank the infamous *Titanic*.

It's taken them 10,000 years to get here, but you can discover them with just a click— *Iceberg Finder*. Sometimes, these frosty giants are spotted from outer space, other times, from a sliver of our 29,000 km of coastline.

Where to Watch

Iceberg Alley stretches from the coast of Labrador to the southeast coast of the island of Newfoundland. Some of the more popular places from shore, or from tour boats, are (from north to south): St. Lewis, Battle Harbour, Red Bay, Point Amour, St. Anthony, La Scie, Twillingate, Fogo Island, Change Islands, Bonavista, St. John's / Cape Spear, and Bay Bulls / Witless Bay. All these locations are accessible by road. The first four, which are on the coast of southern Labrador, can be accessed by car ferry from the island of Newfoundland year-round. The further north, the longer the iceberg season.

Time of Year

The icebergs come through Iceberg Alley from spring to early summer. As you move north, the season stretches a bit longer. April and May are the months when bergs are most plentiful, but they may be locked up in sea ice, so we suggest late May and early June for best viewing.

Ways to Watch

The best ways to watch icebergs are by boat tour, kayak, and from land. Many tourism operators around the province offer boat tours designed to show you the icebergs at their best, along with our visiting whales and numerous sea birds. You can also paddle yourself out to have a look or stand on our amazing coastline and watch them sail by (although they don't move that quickly).

Continuing Professional Education

Did you know.....

There is a new way to track your CPE credits!!

CHIMA's philosophy on Professional Development, as stated in tenet six of the Code of Ethics, is for members "to strive to improve one's professional knowledge and competence through continuing education and lifelong learning."

Did you know CHIMA has a NEW, simpler, more effective way to track your CPE credits?

The process changed as of March 1, 2019 and the revised policy is simplified, better organized, and more comprehensive, allowing more forms of CPE credits.

On March 1, 2019, CHIMA simplified the CPE categories, moving from 9 categories and 31 sub categories to 6 broader categories.

Work to streamline the online CPE tracking system continues. In the interim, we developed a down-loadable, easy-to-use tool for members to track CPE credits. This tool is an Excel document organized to offer quick selection of the new CPE categories while tabulating the CPE credits when entered. There are examples provided within the CPE Tracking Tool.

CPE cycles ending February 28, 2019: Please log in to the Members Only area to track credits in the online system.

CPE cycles ending after March 1, 2019: Please download the CPE Tracking Tool to track credits. Members are only required to track CPE credits in the Excel CPE Tracking Tool, please *do not track your CPE credits in the online tracking system*.
