Angie McCashion, NSPE Chapter Director, has recently been hired in a non-traditional role with Health PEI as the Recorded Information Management (RIM) Coordinator.



This position provides expert advice, leadership, guidance, and assistance to Health PEI Programs and Services staff to manage their recorded information in all physical formats in accordance with relevant legislation (Archives & Records Act, FOIPOP Act and Health Information Act), policies, procedures, standards and guidelines.

The Archives and Records Act requires the Province of PEI to ensure records created and kept by government departments are managed effectively and disposed of responsibly.

The RIM Coordinator develops and implements retention schedules to ensure all Health PEI programs comply with this government mandate to manage all types of records.

Health PEI is a multi-site organization responsible for administrative, operational and client records that employs approximately 6000 staff that includes acute care, community hospitals, long term care, home care, public health, primary care, mental health, addictions, financial services, information management and corporate services.

Angie completed her HIM training at the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology. She has been a Director with the NSPE Chapter Committee since 2016 and is currently the Chair of the Membership Engagement Committee.

DO NOT PUT OFF UNTIL TOMORROW WHAT YOU CAN DO TODAY

I was quite content in my career as an RMS (Resource Management Support) Clerk with the military for 14 years when that door suddenly closed. Due to a medical issue, I was no longer able to perform the physically demanding tasks of military training, so I was released in 2016. I was forced to quickly face one of the most difficult decisions of my life. I loved my career in administration and I was devastated that I was going to have to start over and try to find a new career.

In an effort to make the transition to civilian employment easier, the military offered me the opportunity to take a course up to 2 years in duration to supplement my existing skills. However, I had no idea what course I would take, and to be honest I wasn't too sure I would be able to handle returning to school. Sure I did well in grade school, but I was 41 years old; I hadn't been in school for 23 years! The choice was either take advantage of the opportunity or settle for a job that I might not be happy with.

So I began my research. I always had an interest in the medical field. In fact, I worked in a nursing home for 10 years prior to joining the military. During my research I stumbled across the HIM profession. The opportunity to combine my healthcare experience with my administration experience, brilliant!! There was still one hurdle; physically attending school was not an option due to the distance that I would have to travel daily, and the fact that I have a family that relies on me. So I continued my research, and low and behold, I came across the Centre for Distance Education (CD-ED) offering the very course that was going to save my future! I am almost finished year 2 of this course, and I have absolutely no regrets about my decision. In fact, my only regret about the entire situation is that I did not discover this career sooner! I'm not going to say that it was the easy; it certainly proved to be a great challenge. But it was all that I expected and more. The dedicated staff at CD-ED was always there for me, ensuring I was successful in reaching my full potential. My biggest advice when taking on such a commitment is to exercise self-discipline. Set a schedule and stick to it; do not put off until tomorrow what you can do today!
